If we look at predictions made over the last hundred years, we can see that people have generally not been optimistic. Computers, many people said, would take away our individuality and make us slaves to a machine. This, thankfully, is one prediction that was wrong. Instead of enslaving us, experts now believe that computers will set us free, and here is how it works. Until now, lessons and lectures have been designed with the idea that students and pupils get their information from their instructor (teacher, tutor or professor). We only have to look at the typical classroom to see how this works: chairs and desks for students are all positioned to face the front of the classroom or lecture hall. At the front is a single desk where the instructor sits or stands. Learning takes place because the instructor "gives" knowledge to the students. But there is now so much information on the internet that it is impossible for one instructor to know it all, so his or her role has to change from being the "giver" of knowledge to being "the facilitator" of knowledge. In other words, the instructor helps students to find out information themselves. In a modern classroom, the desks and chairs should be turned so that students can share the information they have found with each other, and this may involve telling the instructor something that he or she did not know.
